Good News Reflection

The fruits of Heaven in our lives today

"The kingdom of God is given to those who produce its fruit." That's the moral of the story that Jesus gives us in this Sunday's Gospel reading. And what is this kingdom of God, given to us while we're still on earth? What are its fruits, which we produce during our earthly lives?



Anything we do in imitation of Christ is a fruit that has grown as a result of following Christ on our journey toward heaven. If we love as he loves, forgive as he forgives, minister to others, teach the truth, and heal the hurting, we are living in the kingdom of God now.

When I ask Catholics if they believe they're going to heaven, most feel very uncertain, either because they're afraid they might lose their salvation through some future grave sin, or because they're afraid it's not humble enough to answer with a firm "yes."

Granted, we do not imitate Christ perfectly. Most of us will need to spend time in Purgatory being purged of whatever is unheavenly about us, but when the purging is finished, we'll be fully alive in the wonderfulness of God. If we make it to Purgatory, of course we'll reach the glories of heaven. And if our desire to be Christ-like is genuine, then of course our sins will never be so "grave" that we turn completely away from Christ. Of course we'll gladly embrace him when he comes for us at the moment of our death.

Whatever you do because of Christ and out of love for Christ, this is evidence that you are living in and will eternally live in God's kingdom.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What good fruits are you producing in your life now? List them; get out a pen and start writing them down. During the week, as you think of more good fruits, add those to the list.

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

Look at the list you produced for the above question. How do these fruits give evidence of God's goodness within you? How do they provide the kingdom of God for the benefit of others? How do they assure you that you are truly a heaven-bound follower of Christ?

During these unprecedented times, we begin out Faith Formation classes on Monday, October 5. It is imperative to keep these young ones get closer and closer to Jesus. We are trying our best to keep it safe for them as well as the catechists. There are so many aspects we need to focus on and put into practice. The following are some of the precautions we are installing to make sure the safety of everyone.

Safety Procedures:

Classes will be held every other week. Every student and adult entering the school building is required to wear a face mask. There are hand sanitizer stations upstairs in the hallway. Class sizes are limited to eight students, and desks are spaced 6 feet apart.

As an additional safety measure, the parish center doors will be locked during classes, and nobody is allowed to enter the building. We have installed a "Smart-lock" with a camera, doorbell, and microphone. Please ring the doorbell, and someone will assist you over the microphone. Children will be brought out of the building to each parent. If you need to enter the building, please explain your need over the microphone, and the exterior door will be unlocked for you.

What Happens if the School District Has Another Shutdown?

If the school should close for a week or more, parents/guardians will be responsible for continuing Faith Formation at home. Each student has a textbook and some form of online content. You will be able to access all videos and textbook apps from our Parish Website: ABVMCentereach.com under the Faith Formation, Levels 1-8 tab. Your child's catechist will contact each family with more information if the schools do a shutdown.



A Message to the Faithful

As our valued partner in providing spiritual, educational, charitable and cultural activities in the Long Island community, the Diocese of Rockville Centre felt it was important to share the news with you that today we have filed a voluntary petition for reorganization under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. In addition to the media release attached to this email, a video message from Bishop Barres announcing this filing and other information regarding the filing is posted on the diocesan website: www.drvc.org.

We took this necessary action to manage litigation expenses, address disputes with the Diocese's insurers and facilitate settlements of lawsuits filed under the Child Victims Act. Like many other institutions and the parishioners, we serve, the Diocese has suffered a strain on its finances as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Approximately 40 percent of our annual revenue comes from offertory collections, which have dropped precipitously with attendance at Sunday Mass.

We believe the restructuring process is the only way to ensure a fair and equitable outcome for everyone involved, including abuse survivors whose compensation settlements will be resolved by the courts.

But rest assured, this process will impede neither our mission to be a spiritual resource to the 1.4 million Catholics who reside in Long Island nor our partnership with your organization.

The Diocese believes its current and future liquidity will be sufficient to fund operations and ministries during the restructuring process and beyond. Operations of the parishes and schools are expected to continue as normal.

We will work diligently with all survivors, creditors and ministries to maintain open communication while we work toward our goal of completing a settlement and finalizing a restructuring plan that includes a comprehensive and fair resolution for survivors.
