
## From the Pastor's Desk

## **Catholic Ministries Appeal**

I want to thank everyone who helped make last year's 2018 Catholic Ministries Appeal a success. The diocese collected over ten million dollars, which was used to support many services for the people on Long Island.

Your generosity enabled our parish to reach our assigned goal of \$57,400, thus bringing back to the parish \$14,322 in monies that have been redirected to parish activities.

This year our parish 2019 goal remains \$57,400. Your generosity provides us with an opportunity to



reach out to those in need by supporting the many programs run by our diocese. In particular, the CMA enables our Catholic community on Long Island to support the work of Catholic Charities, our Catholic Regional Schools, programs for ongoing formation and training of lay leaders as well as our deacons; our seminary which trains men for the priesthood as well as various pastoral offices which provide excellent resources throughout the diocese are also funded by the Appeal. This is but a short listing of a large number of worthwhile programs which your generous contributions support. In addition, parishes who make their goal receive a rebate from the diocese, amounting to 20% of the actual goal.

To date we have received \$39,000 in pledges—almost 70% of our goal. Please ask the Lord how you might participate. You pledge is payable over a ten-month period of time. Remember also, that one does not have to donate a large amount; joining everyone's sacrificial gift adds up to a great resource for those in need.

## Join AYM's Famine Challenge

This year AYM's lock-in theme will be "Fight against Global Hunger." We will do this by carrying out a 30-hour famine, joining forces with the "30-Hour Famine" global youth movement to end hunger.

We will challenge ourselves to fast for 30 hours, starting March 29<sup>th</sup> and ending on March 30<sup>th</sup>. The goal will be to go without food for 30 hours, trusting that the Lord will bless this sacrifice by feeding our souls: spiritually, by bringing us closer to God as we focus our thoughts on prayer, and the Lord's heart for the poor; physically, by helping us experience something of what families go through every day, thereby leading us to greater empathy and understanding; relationally, by pulling our AYM community closer together as we experience hunger and hope as one.

We know very well that the global hunger won't disappear in 30 hours, but if we take the first step nothing will slow us down. We invite our entire parish family, therefore, to join us in this fast, and then gather with us at our parish's 5:30 p.m. mass on March 30<sup>th</sup> to end our fast by being nourished with the Bread of Life.

Most importantly, please pray for us, especially on March 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, when we will be fasting. You also can support our efforts by putting a donation, even if it's only a dollar, in the jars we will have available after all the masses on the weekend of March 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup>. That dollar can feed a child for a day! You can be a prayer buddy by praying for a specific person from our ministry on March 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> (call Renata, ext. 121, for details), or you can fast in your own setting during the same time we are fasting.

## **Lenten Fasting and Abstinence**

In keeping with the spirit of penance, all Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fiftynine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of
fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This
means limiting oneself to a single full meal and
avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals,
which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health
would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper
cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required
to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good
Friday fast and abstinence.
