More than 80% have completely redeemed their pledge with the other 20% faithfully sending in their payments. To date we have collected 88% of the total amount pledged. Many thanks. As mentioned previously, we "borrowed" \$200,000 from our savings to complete the parking lot. Good News Reflection

How love humbles us into righteousness

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, we see what happens when our primary motivation in whatever we do is not love but self-centeredness. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled." Sooner or later, self-exalting people get humbled, whether they realize it or not. They are brought down low by their own behaviors. People who encounter them in daily life do not think very highly of them. And certainly, God doesn't either.

The much better alternative is to let our love for others be what humbles us.

Without love as our motivation, we believe in our own so-called "righteousness," thinking we're okay when we're not. But when we do good deeds for others because we genuinely care about them, the pride of our self-righteousness is replaced by holy humility.



We are made righteous by our love for others. Self-righteousness is self-made -- it motivates us to do good, but only for the selfish purpose of looking admirable, winning God's approval, or gaining some other personal benefit. Love, which is true righteousness, motivates us to do good for the sake of others.

Look at the Pharisee in Jesus' parable. We all behave like that from time to time. Think of someone who is inferior to you because you are holier, who doesn't go to church as often as you do, or who doesn't pray like you do. Think of someone who is not worthy of your time and caregiving. Think of someone who is too difficult to love.

The cure for this self-righteousness is to get in touch with God's concern for them. Once we unite our hearts to God's love for them, we begin to care about them, too. And the most powerful, most successful way to accomplish such union with God is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which absolves us of self-righteousness and empowers us with divine grace to absorb Christ's own righteousness.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

Think of those who are less spiritually active than you, e.g., family, friends, co-workers, and parishioners who cause you to think: "Thank God I am not like them!" Do you grieve for them because of their sins and blindness? Do you do anything to help them grow closer to Christ? Do they experience Jesus every time they encounter you?

Questions for Family & Community Faith Sharing:

What are some ways that you show love to those who are not as holy as you, or not as emotionally healthy as you, or not as intelligent as you? Describe a time when you were more self-righteous than righteous. How did you (or how will you) let Jesus turn your pride into love-filled humility?



Financial Report: September 2018 through August 2019



Here is our parish's financial report from our last budget year. Rather than give a list of incomprehensible numbers, I've divided income/expenses into recognizable categories, e.g., Sunday collections, program fees, parish offices, etc. Hopefully, this gives a clearer idea of where the money comes from and where it went. Expenses such as utilities, salaries, etc. have been proportionately divided them into several categories, e.g., Parish Office, Faith For-mation, Church, etc. For those interested in the exact amount of items, I've listed a couple of our annual bills so you get a sense of how much must be spent just to keep the doors opened: gas, \$14,891; electric, \$21,667; water, \$4,194;

snow removal, \$6,330; insurance, \$52,777; garbage removal, \$4,700; grounds, \$18,248

The goal is to have our operating expenses covered by our regular income without using our sav-ings or interest. The operating expenses are what it costs to operate our day-to-day programs, while capital or extraordinary expenses -are one-time costs covered by taking money from savings or having a capital campaign. As you can see from the Income/Expense chart, we had a deficit in terms of our operating budget. There are two reasons for this. There was a decrease in our parish's overall income, including collections and program fees. There was also an overall increase in prices, such as insurance, etc. I would be remiss if I did not make it clear that using our savings to cover an operating deficit cannot be the accepted practice if we are to continue as a functioning parish entity.

For the parish to thrive, we have to raise the level of sacrificial giving. Our growth and well-being as a parish cannot be maintained unless everyone who considers themselves a parishioner offers their sacrificial financial support generously. If our parish is going to achieve a positive trajectory, we have to be real-istic in terms of parish support. Unfortunately, many who use our parish's services and activities assume that someone else will cover expenses. Others continue to give at the level they gave ten-to twenty years ago, con-vinced that a few dollars offered when and if they come to mass, is sufficient.

One way of improving and sta-bilizing our financial situation would be for families to participate in *Faith Direct*, our parish's eGiving program. This easy-to-use service allows families to have their parish offering deducted automatically from their account or charged to their credit card. It's a great way to "take a step" toward a stewardship way of life, which is one of the characteristics of discipleship. Fr. Chris and I use this for our weekly parish offering. You can get additional information by picking up a brochure in the lobby or by going to www.FaithDirect.net. Our parish code is NY563.

Finally, this past year, we entered the third year of our parish's Capital Campaign. I am grateful to the 330 families and individuals who contributed to our Campaign. Thus far, we have approximately \$709,000 in pledges and have received \$616,546 in paid pledges. Fulfilled pledges have allowed us to accomplish all the projects we anticipated, e.g., refurbishment of the church interior, a new roof, church basement AV system and repairs to outside windows Because the parking lot had become hazardous, we had to have it repaved this year instead of waiting until 2020 as planned. A large withdrawal had to be made from our savings account to pay for this expense. We do rely upon all those who are still fulfilling their pledges to do so in or-der to allow us to replenish our diminishing savings account.

Together we rely on God's abundance. I remain convinced that the Lord has much more prepared for us than we are receiving. We cannot receive these additional gifts, however, without consciously moving in the direction of putting every part of our life under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. For that reason, our ongo-ing stewardship efforts will continue to help us appropriate all that the Lord wishes to offer. In the meantime, the Income/Expense chart gives us an idea of where we've been over the past fiscal year.
