

Good News Reflection

Who is Jesus to YOU?

Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do people say I am?" and "Who do you think I am?" This is a typical question for most of us, too. We want to know what people think about us, which often influences our self-concept, actions, reasoning, and confidence. Sometimes, caring too much about what others think can be unhealthy, but other times, when seeking a close relationship with someone, this is very important.

People usually try to get to know each other first before entering any true and lasting friendship, especially a romantic relationship. Spending time together to learn what is important to one another is crucial. We try to learn everything we can about each other's likes/dislikes, values, hopes, dreams, goals, fears, concerns, and life experiences. After sharing, we may ask ourselves, "how do they see me? Does this person accept me for who I am?" The other person probably thinks the same thing because mutual acceptance builds respect and trust, vital in any loving relationship.



Jesus wanted a personal, loving, and trusting relationship with His disciples and desires the same kind of intimate friendship with us. Once the disciples acknowledged Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, Jesus told them the hard truths they would need to accept, even if they didn't yet fully understand, that He would suffer, die, and rise from the dead. Not only this, but all who love and believe in Him must do the same if they genuinely trust Him.

Today, Jesus continues to ask, "Who am I to you? Are you willing to spend time with me as your intimate friend and confidant? Do you believe my teachings even when it seems hard? Are you willing to put your faith in me into action? Will you accept your own suffering, persecutions, trials, and crosses in this life, trusting that I will carry you to eternal joy and peace with my Father?"

Ouestions for Personal Reflection:

Are there some parts of your life where you must align your actions with your Catholic beliefs? What crosses and sacrifices has God asked you to bear, and has any good come from them?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How can you strengthen your relationship with Jesus and your acceptance of difficult Church teachings? How can you help others in their journey of faith?




Week Two: Scripture: Mark 8:27-35

We struggle with having enough, but what if enough isn't even the right goal. What if in our struggle to have enough and make sure we have enough we are missing out on our real responsibility in life.

The real goal of life is not to make sure we have enough or do enough on our own but that we follow Jesus who is our Messiah. In this message we will look at how we need to change focus from having enough to following Jesus who is the Son of God.

Enough is a shadow. It is illusive and so we should change our goal from having enough to following. If I follow Jesus than I will have enough. Have a sense of relief that I don't have to make enough my goal. A feeling of "aha" of course I should not make enough my goal.



As you already know, at Assumption, we preach in message series. Over several weeks, we will examine a topic in depth. We select a topic based on the weekend's scripture readings.

Usually, we welcome back everyone with a new series on the second Sunday of September. This year, for ob-

vious reasons, we are not able to do that. But we are not entirely going away from the series either. This is what happens. The theme is **Important Enough**. We are not preaching on the theme, but Small Groups will have their videos and reflection questions sent to them. A summary of each Sunday will be printed in the bulletin and sent in the Daily Practice emails. If you are a small group leader, you will get them by next week. We are hoping that small groups will start again regularly in the week of September 9th. Also, we will start again with our Daily Practice – daily reflections emails, if you have signed up to get them that same week too. Please see the details about it right under this note. We will discuss it by reflecting on the week's readings.

God speaks to us at every moment, especially in a community setting, when His people come together on Sundays and listen to the Word of God as we celebrate, pray, praise, and thank God. Then the discussion continues in the Small Groups and goes deeper. Our message series usually runs from September to July. Our mission continues to Love God, Serve Others, and Grow Disciples.

Repairs, Repairs...



Repairs are inevitable, especially if the building is older. Our parish center building is 54 years old, and some of its plumbing and other equipment is I would say 'original'. Over the years, we ignored some things and postponed some for later repair. Well, that later time is now. The water heater in the Parish Center had not been working correctly for a long time, and the restroom fixtures needed to be fixed or replaced, too. Each repair is not much, but it becomes expensive when they all come together. Also, the church's restroom in the Sacristy (where the priests vest and prepare) didn't have hot water for a long time, either. We must fix all this because it must be done sooner than later otherwise it becomes too expensive and problematic. We are in the process of repairing it.

In addition, we had an unexpected expense with our Fire Alarm Panel in the Parish Center, which needs to be replaced. Altogether, it is almost \$16000 – \$17000. I know it is all part of the maintenance we need to do. When you postpone it for years, it returns to you in significant numbers. I just want to let you know what is going on with the things that need to be taken care of and where our money goes. I am very grateful to you all for your generosity in supporting our parish and God's providence. We believe in a God who works with and in us, and I have complete faith in Him that he will guide us and lead us. Giving to our place of worship is an act of worship.
