Good News Reflection A True Disciple Takes Up His Cross and Follows Jesus, the Humble Servant.

Jesus tried to help His disciples understand the true nature of His kingdom. The people wanted to make Him king. He knew they hoped He would save them from civil turmoil and free them from Roman oppression. But Jesus came to establish the Kingdom of God, not a worldly kingdom. He came to teach them about His Father's love and the reign of God's holy will in their hearts. He wanted to take their souls to an everlasting spiritual kingdom for those willing to follow Him, accept self-denial, and take up their crosses.



Jesus' disciples didn't understand, and couldn't yet accept, the truths He tried to tell them about His upcoming passion, the suffering He would bear, His crucifixion and death on the cross, and His resurrection. They didn't realize that Jesus is the Servant Lord and we, all His disciples, are to follow His example. We are called to be servants to others. We must suffer and die, and then, because of our Savior Jesus Christ, our souls will rise to eternal life. Christ's disciples would not understand all this completely until they received the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Jesus found His disciples squabbling amongst themselves over rank and status, fussing over which one of them was the greatest. They were probably "counting their chickens before they hatched," as they dreamed of being part of the new King's inner circle. Jesus stopped all this when He used a child to show them that, in His Kingdom, true greatness comes from being last and serving all. Greatness is defined by humility, purity of intentions, and service to others. Those who love and follow Christ with the open, pure, and innocent heart of a child that is willing to trust and obey Him will be welcomed first in the Kingdom of God.

Jesus used a child to show that we must welcome and care for everyone, even those society sees as least important. Comparing ourselves to others only leads to jealousy, pride, and unhealthy ambition. God gives each of us unique gifts to serve others and do His will. The Holy Spirit can help us value ourselves and our gifts without competing with others.

Questions for Personal Reflection: What motivates you to serve others? How do you live out humility and service in your daily life?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing: How can we accept our crosses and help others bear theirs? How can our crosses be gifts in disguise?



Week three Scripture: James 3:16-4:3

Enough is the wrong goal but what do we do when we find out that we don't have enough. We don't have enough in the checking account. We don't have enough in the relational bank account.

There is one of two problems. We see them spelled out in the letter of James. Either we don't have enough because it is what we want is not good. It is not healthy. Or because we just haven't asked. We haven't asked God to give us what we needed and partnered with him to provide it.

James tells us that our lack of satisfaction and feeling we are doing enough often comes from our passions. We have a restless spirit. And because our spirit is restless we feel like we do not have enough. In this message we will look at how our passions cause us to feel like we do not have or have not done enough. We will then look at the simple solution James gives us to ask for what we need, knowing God will provide what we will need.

What do we want them do? Evaluate your desires. Anything they couldn't ask God for is probably a disordered passion.



As you already know, at Assumption, we preach in message series. Over several weeks, we will examine a topic in depth. We select a topic based on the weekend's scripture readings.

Usually, we welcome back everyone with a new series on the sec-

ond Sunday of September. This year, for obvious reasons, we are not able to do that. But we are not entirely going away from the series either. This is what happens. The theme is **Important Enough**. We are not preaching on the theme, but Small Groups will have their videos and reflection questions sent to them. A summary of each Sunday will be printed in the bulletin and sent in the Daily Practice emails. We are hoping that small groups will start again regularly in the week of September 9th. If you haven't signed up to get them please see the details about it below. We will discuss it by reflecting on the week's readings.

God speaks to us at every moment, especially in a community setting, when His people come together on Sundays and listen to the Word of God as we celebrate, pray, praise, and thank God. Then the discussion continues in the Small Groups and goes deeper. Our message series usually runs from September to July. Our mission continues to Love God, Serve Others, and Grow Disciples.
