

Good News Reflection

How much do you trust in God?

Following Jesus requires a tremendous amount of trust, because he often takes us to unexpected places that require new growth, sacrifices, and moving beyond the boundaries of what's familiar and comfortable.

Consider the two widows in this Sunday's first reading and the Gospel reading. How could they give what common sense says they could not afford? Did they know with total certainty that God would take care of their needs? No. So they gave all they had because they were so in love with God that they trusted his love for them

Trust is a sign of genuine love – especially when the one we trust is God. We can love others more freely and generously if we trust God to help us through the difficulties that occur when people prove themselves untrustworthy. Our freedom to love others unconditionally is not based upon how safe we are with them; it's based on how safe we are with God.



Each widow gave what she could not afford to lose. We cannot afford to love those who will cause us grief and disappointment and feelings of rejection, and yet Jesus tells us to forgive them and do good to them and go the extra mile for them.

Sometimes doing good to those who are difficult to love must include "tough love", which asserts boundaries that they are not allowed to cross. Remember what Jesus did: Until Good Friday, Jesus always walked away from his persecutors. Did he stop loving them? Not at all. And sometimes it means enabling them to reap what they sow so that they begin to understand their need to repent. Instead of cleaning up their messes, we have to let them suffer from it. Think about it: Does God clean up our messes before we repent? Usually he won't even do that after we repent. What would we learn if someone else does the damage control?

Loving others always includes sacrificing ourselves and relying on God to comfort us, heal us, restore us, and bless us. We can trust God for this. Our jar of whatever we pour out to others for the sake of love will never go empty.

Questions for Personal Reflection: What needs healing or correction in your thinking so you can feel secure and fully loved by God?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing: Describe a time when you gave more than you thought you could give: more money, more love, more time, more patience – more of anything. What motivated you to be so generous? What were the end results? What did you learn?

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

Week Four – Offering as Prayer Scripture: Mark 12:41-44

Jesus sat outside the Temple and watched how people gave. He commends the widow who gives two coins to the Temple because she gives out of her substance. Our giving to God is a form of prayer and worship. When it comes to our giving, Jesus does not commend people who give large amounts but people who give dangerously, who give in a way that places their faith and trust in God.

Giving from our substance is a form of prayer and worship. Pray and reflect on what God is calling you to give in the year ahead. We are challenged to trust God with our money and finances.



As you already know, at Assumption, we preach in message series. Over several weeks, we will examine a topic in depth. We select a topic based on the weekend's scripture readings.

God speaks to us at every moment, especially in a community setting, when His people come together on Sun-

days and listen to the Word of God as we celebrate, pray, praise, and thank God. Then the discussion continues in the Small Groups and goes deeper. Our message series usually runs from September to July. Our mission continues to Love God, Serve Others, and Grow Disciples.

At the beginning of the Mass, children will be sent forth with catechists and assistants downstairs to the church basement to reflect and share the scriptures read at the Mass. A presentation is given, and then the children share in their small groups. This is an excellent opportunity for our youngest to engage during the Mass at

their own level. We are ready to hear and be part of the stories of our parish's youngest disciples and invite them to the most incredible adventure of their lives, reminding them weekly, year after year, that our Father is madly after their hearts. Water... Water... everywhere

On October 22nd, in the parish center, one of the valves in the toilet closer to



the offices on the second floor, burst, and you can imagine the mess and chaos that ensued. Water came out of it like a fire hydrant, flowing down to the offices, one of the classrooms, and then downstairs to the Library. Thankfully, it happened a few minutes after the faith formation classes ended, and some adults were around. The Fire Department was called, and they closed the



main valve to turn the water off within 20 minutes. There was water everywhere; a restoration company came, and

they were able to get rid of the water right away.

Office floors were all soaked. The Library had a lot of damage, and everything there had to be replaced except the furniture and electronics, including the carpet, the wall panels, and the ceiling. Office carpets and some sheet rock on the walls must also be replaced. In short, office workings will be interrupted for a while. It seems like it is going to be a couple of months. Since the restoration company began work, we need to figure out how to make the offices work well. We will probably move the offices temporarily to the north end of the parish center. I ask you to be patient until it is restored. We



use the library for a lot of meetings and faith formation classes. Those meetings and classes must be rescheduled, probably in the parish center hall.

As you can see, many things need to be considered. We are working with the insurance company to replace whatever needs to be replaced and open the library and offices. Since the work will take about two to three months, the room that we are moving offices to be prepared with electrical outlets and computer connections. I am confident that all this will be done soon with the grace and providence of our Lord. I am thankful to our Lord that it did not happen at night when no one was around. Once again, thank you very much for your patience and generosity. As the work moves on, I will update you.
